KMHO and the Moshi Dioceses are committed to ensuring there are safe water access points within 70 meters of every home in the Diocese. At present we are focused on working alongside local families to provide them a safe water supply and a large project in the Rombo District. Meet your sponsored seminarian, child, student, or priest!

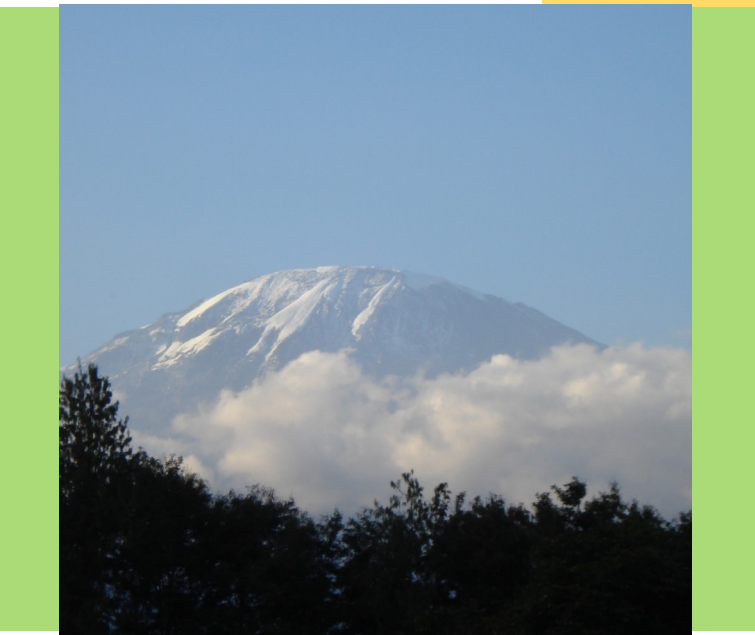
Visit Upendo orphanage. Attend the priest ordination and celebration masses of some of the newly ordained priests. Tour St. Pamachius school.

The distribution of financial support is under the direction of Rt. Rev. Ludovick Joseph Minde, ALCP/OSS, Bishop of the Moshi Diocese.

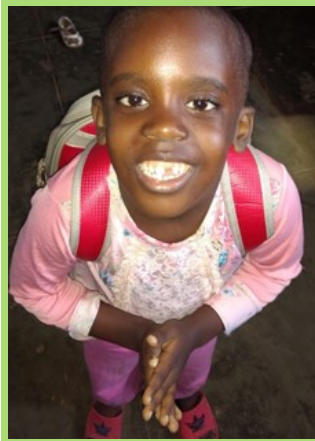
Seminarian Sponsorship

KMHO's oldest program, the Seminarian Sponsorship provides support for a boy or man who has been called to the priesthood.

Since the program started in 2005, 74 KMHO sponsored seminarians have been ordained as priests. Currently, 78 seminarians are supported by KMHO sponsors, with another 60 still available for sponsorships.

Child Sponsorships

This program supports children who have lost one or both of their parents due to death, disease, or neglect from birth through primary school (age 13). These children are currently cared for by other family members, by other families, or at Upendo orphanage.

Student Sponsorships

This program provides tuition, room and board, and other school fees for young people striving to get a higher level of education.

For most Tanzanians, formal education ends with primary school at the age of 13. Few students enter and complete secondary school. Fewer still go on to study in vocational schools and universities.

We currently have 54 students who are dreaming of becoming doctors, engineers, teachers, and more. They're willing to study hard. They just need your support.

St. Pamachius Inclusive Secondary School

The Moshi Diocese is home to the only secondary school in Tanzania where students with physical limitations (e.g., blindness/low vision, hearing impairment, Albinism, epilepsy, etc.) can attend high school along with students without impairments.

This school has grown from a field of rubble and weeds to what it is today. St. Pamachius now serves 275 students in Forms 1-3 (similar to U.S. grades 9-11) and has run out of classroom space. Currently, these students attend classes in the dining hall, but six new classrooms are under construction. They are scheduled to be completed by the end of October.

KMHO has raised all funds necessary for this new construction, including classroom furniture, from donors across the U.S.A. (Students at Karanga Technical School in the Moshi Diocese will build the furniture.) But there are still more needs at St. Pamachius. Books, lab equipment, and dormitories are at the top of the list. We are confident, however, that with God's help—and your continuing generosity—more donations will be forthcoming.
